Benefits Law Briefing Webinar: Health Reform Litigation

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The American Benefits Council will host a **Benefits Law Briefing webinar** on **Wednesday, November 20 at 2 p.m. Eastern Time** to discuss practical considerations related to potential litigation risk and the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA).

Guest speaker **James Napoli**, *senior counsel with Proskauer Rose LLP*, will address a range of potential litigation risks related to PPACA implementation as employers consider near and long-term strategies for providing health benefits for their workforce. These include whistleblower actions, worker misclassification and PPACA audits. The discussion will include practical recommendations for avoiding and minimizing potentially costly litigation risk, including:

- How to develop an employee communication campaign that addresses key PPACA concerns while avoiding unnecessary litigation exposure;
- The causes of action available to employees seeking mandated benefits and strategies to avoid those actions;
- The litigation risks inherent with “workforce realignment” and how to minimize those risks; and
- Preparing for PPACA audits and related best practices.
