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The American Benefits Council will continue its **P4P ... Preparing for PPACA** series on **Thursday, May 22, at 2 p.m. Eastern Time**, with a webinar on final regulations implementing requirements for information reporting to the IRS by insurers and applicable large employers as required by the Patient Protection and Affordable Care Act (PPACA).

As we reported in the [March 5 Benefits Byte](#), the final regulations were released in two parts to implement separate sections of the Internal Revenue Code: final regulations on the [reporting of MEC](#) (under Section 6055) and employer [reporting of health insurance coverage](#) (under Section 6056). Section 6055 information reporting will be used by the IRS to enforce the individual mandate. The Section 6056 reporting will be used to administer the employer mandate and the premium tax credit. The reporting requirements were delayed for 2014 under previously issued [Notice 2013-45](#) transition relief and will not be effective until 2015 (first reporting is due in early 2016).
